

Installation Instructions for Mambo.

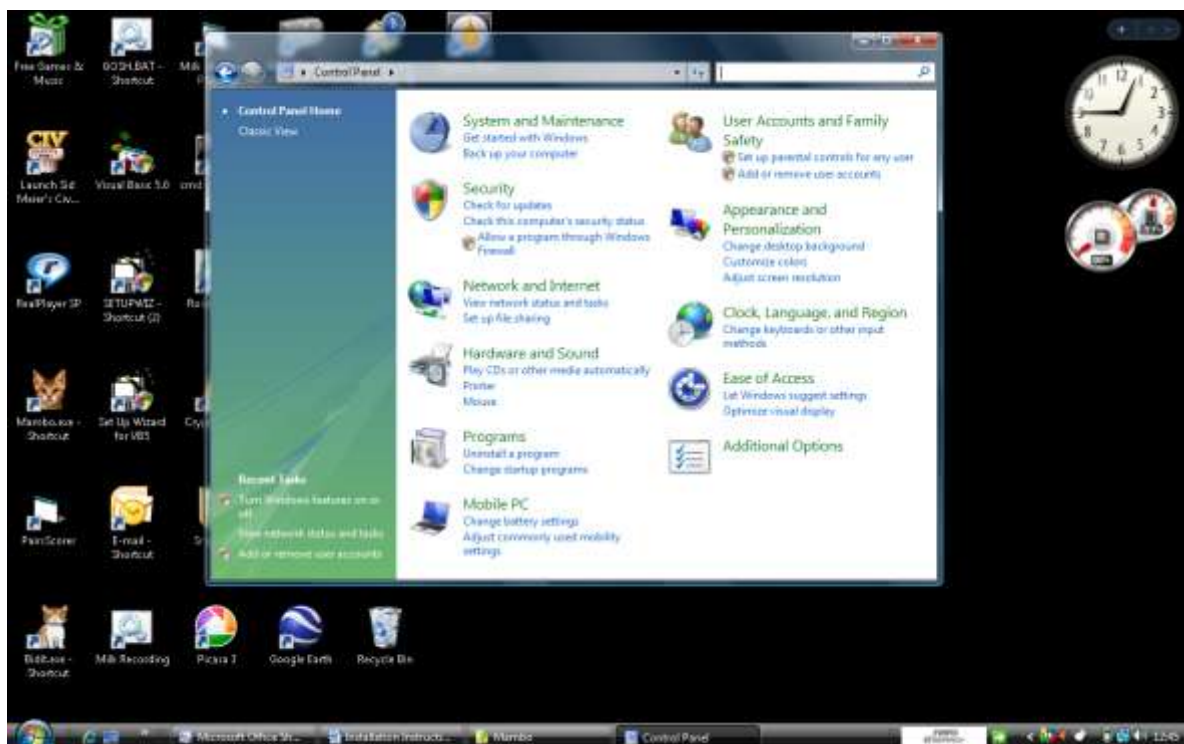
These instructions assume you are downloading the software from my website. Installation from other media may well be different – follow the instructions supplied with the media.

Under Windows Vista

If you have already installed Mambo, **you should uninstall** it before installing the latest version – uninstalling will not cause you to lose any data you have created with the previous version – it will only remove the application code not any data.

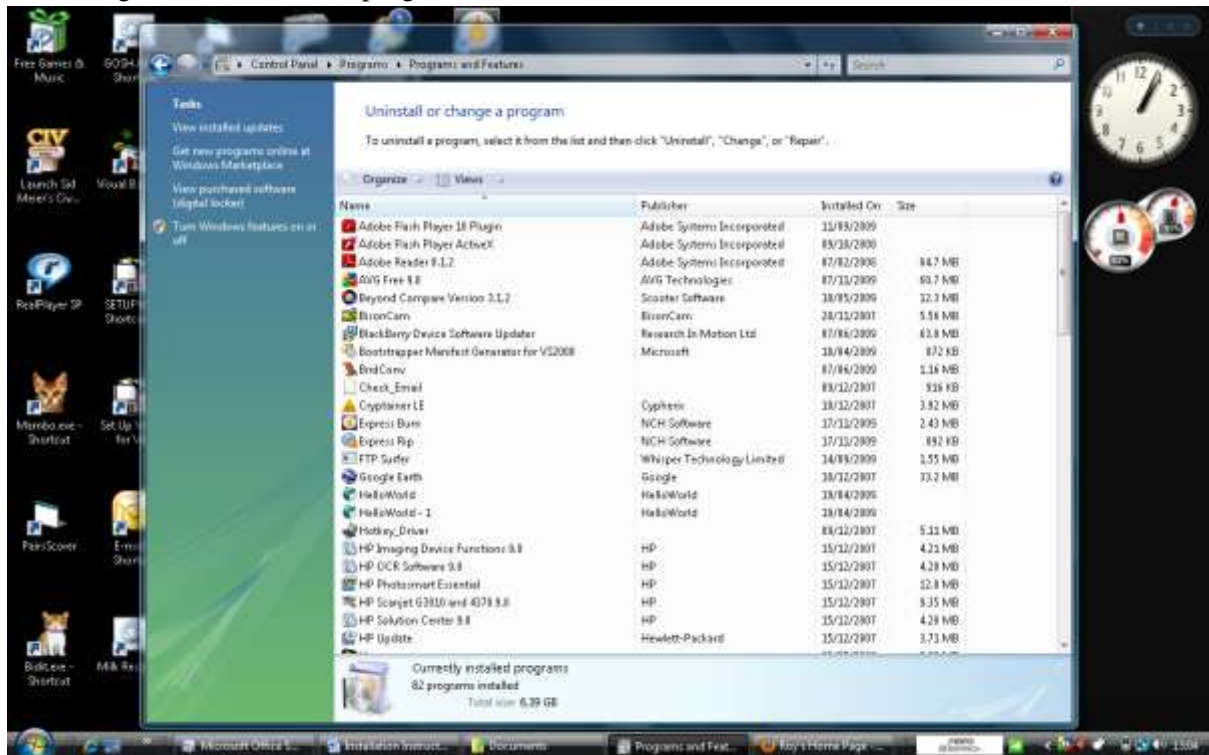
To Uninstall Mambo do the following:

Left Click the Windows Start button (bottom left of your screen), and select Control Panel. You should have a view as below) – if you have the Classic View displayed click on Control Panel Home.



Select Programs – Uninstall a program.

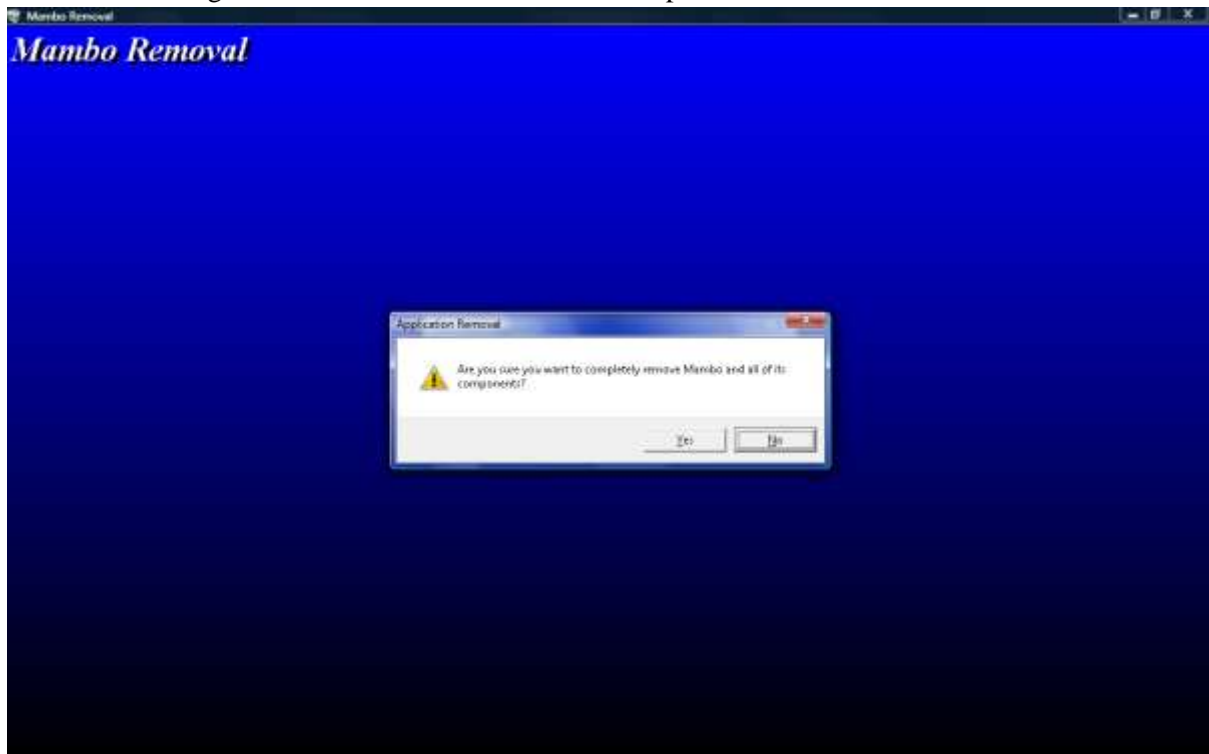
You will get a list of installed programs as below:



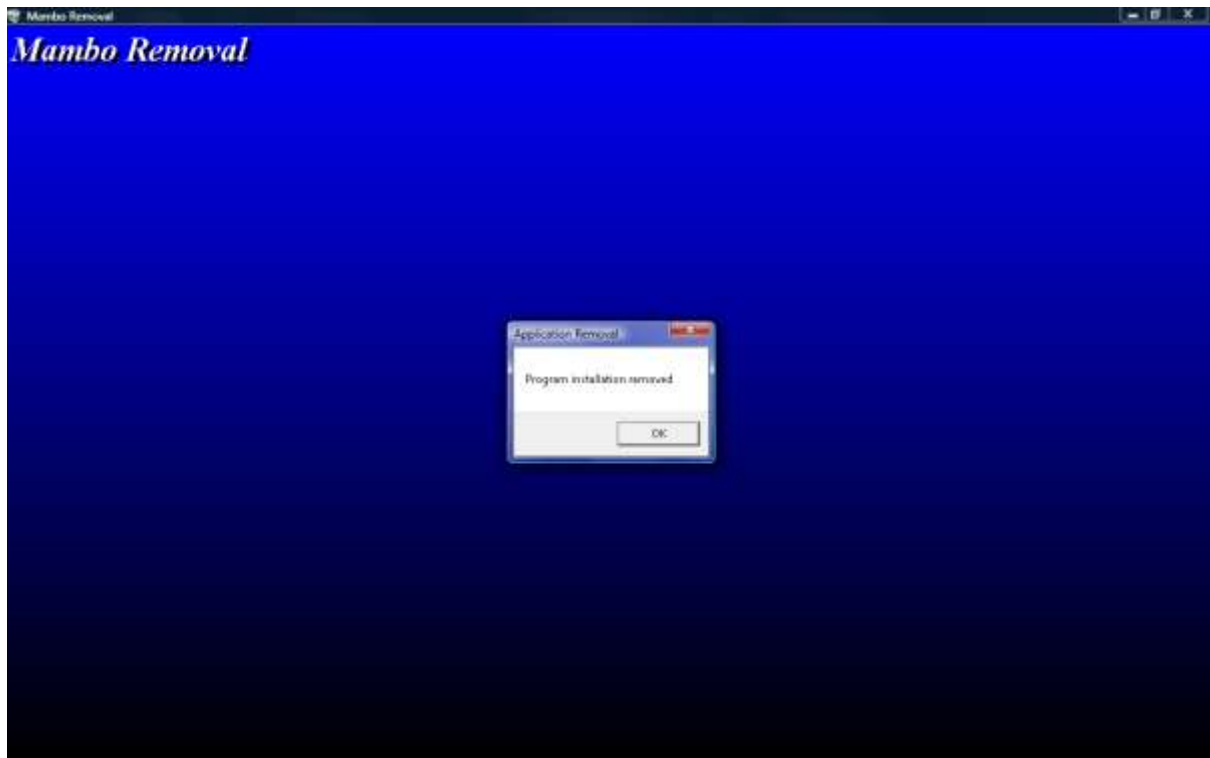
Scroll down until you get to Mambo – double click the Mambo entry.

You will probably get a “Windows needs your permission to continue pop up – click Continue.

You should then get the Mambo Removal confirmation panel



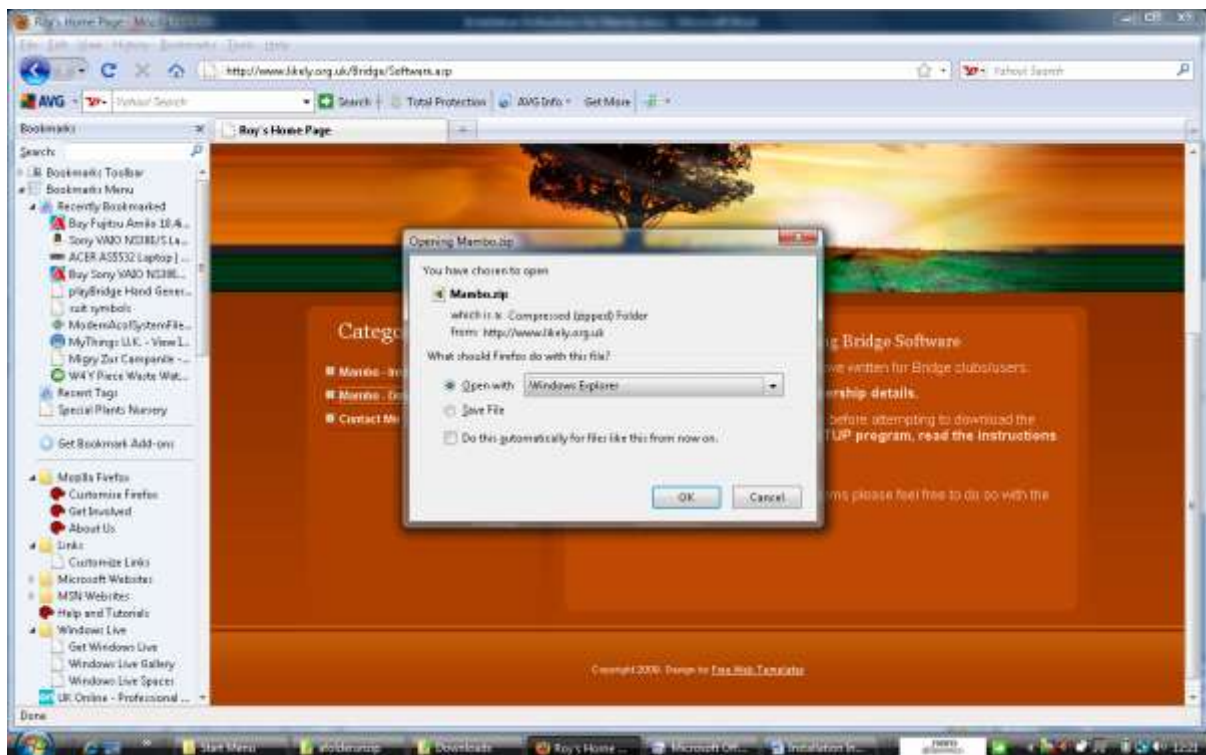
Click Yes, - you may get pop-ups asking you to delete shared components – click the Keep option if this occurs. You should then have the completion screen below – click OK - you have uninstalled Mambo.



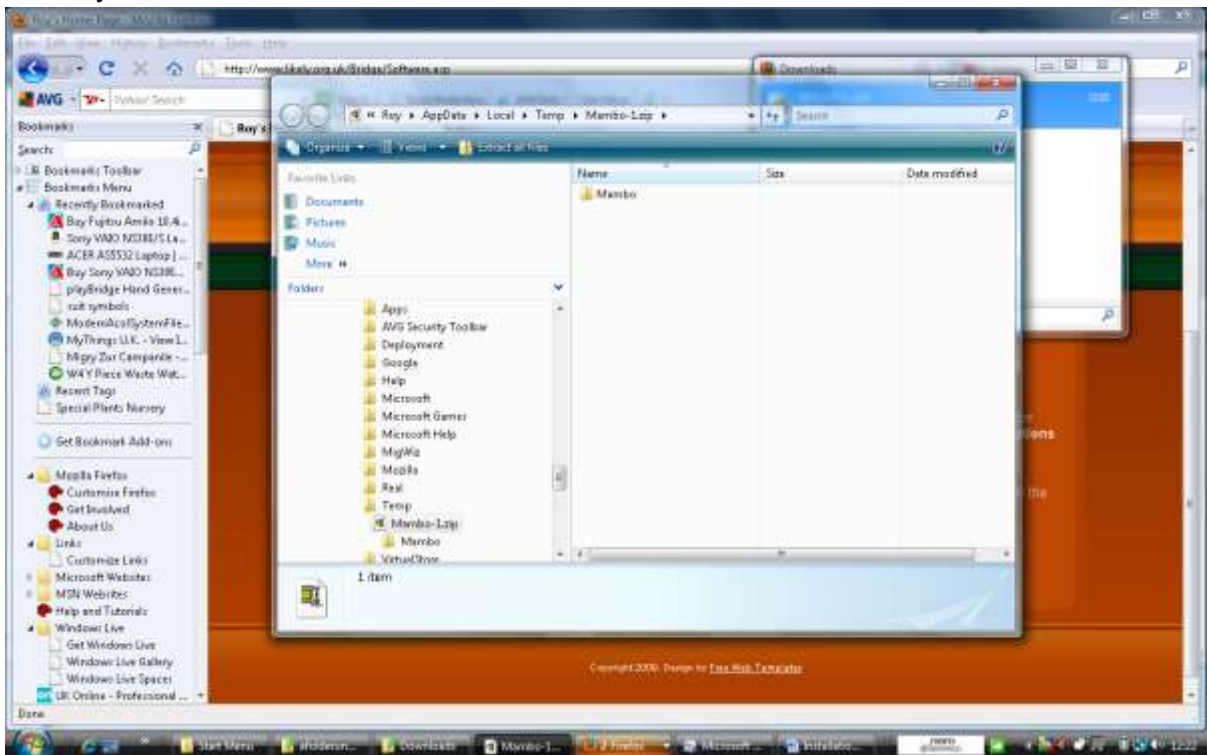
Installing Mambo

First click on the link on the Website -- > **Mambo - Download Software**

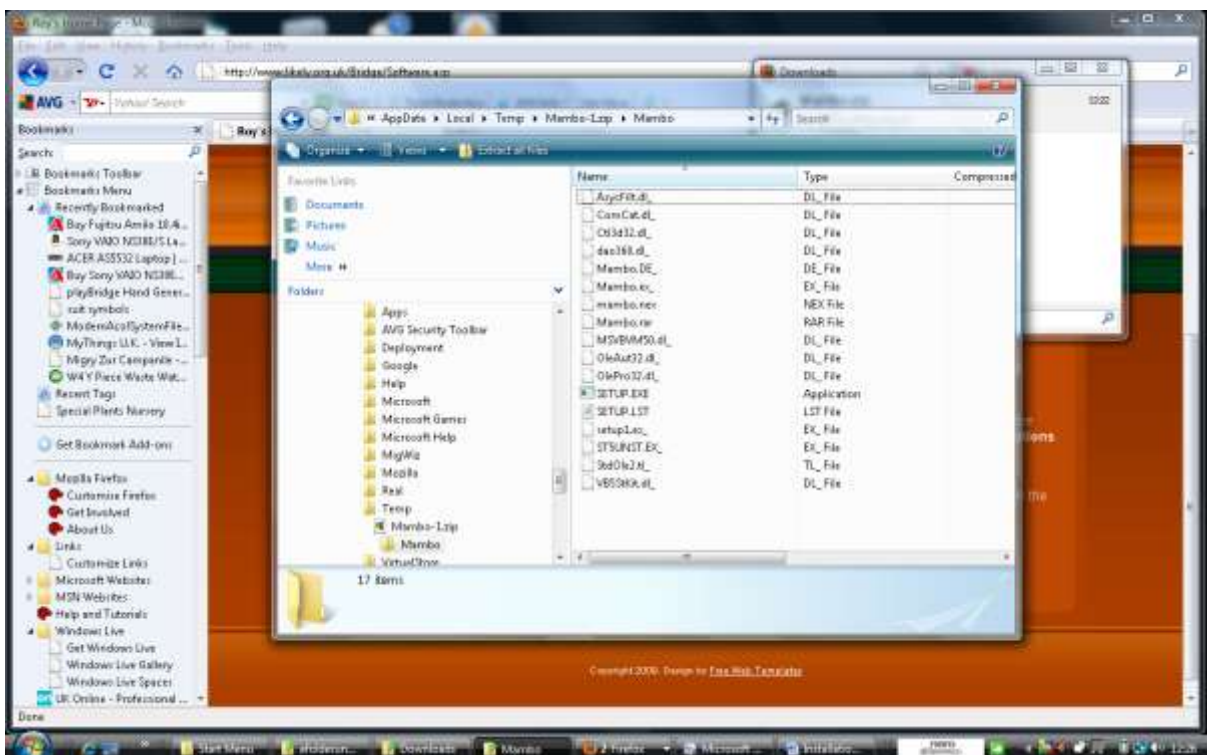
You should get a pop up window something like below – the default program may not be Windows Explorer if you have any other decompression software (like Winrar/WinZip) installed, then that may be quoted. If not Windows Explorer, then click the down arrow next to the “Open with” entry and then click “Other”. You should then be presented with a list of suitable programs – select Windows Explorer. And then your screen should be as below.



Now Click OK. Explorer should create a new directory and place the expanded software into a directory structure similar to this



The actual directory structure may be (see above) Temp>Mambo or Temp-Mambo-n-Zip depending on your environment. In any event double click on Mambo in the right pane. And the screen should now be



To install Mambo for the first time – or to reinstall having uninstalled as above - then double click on the SETUP application.

(It might appear as

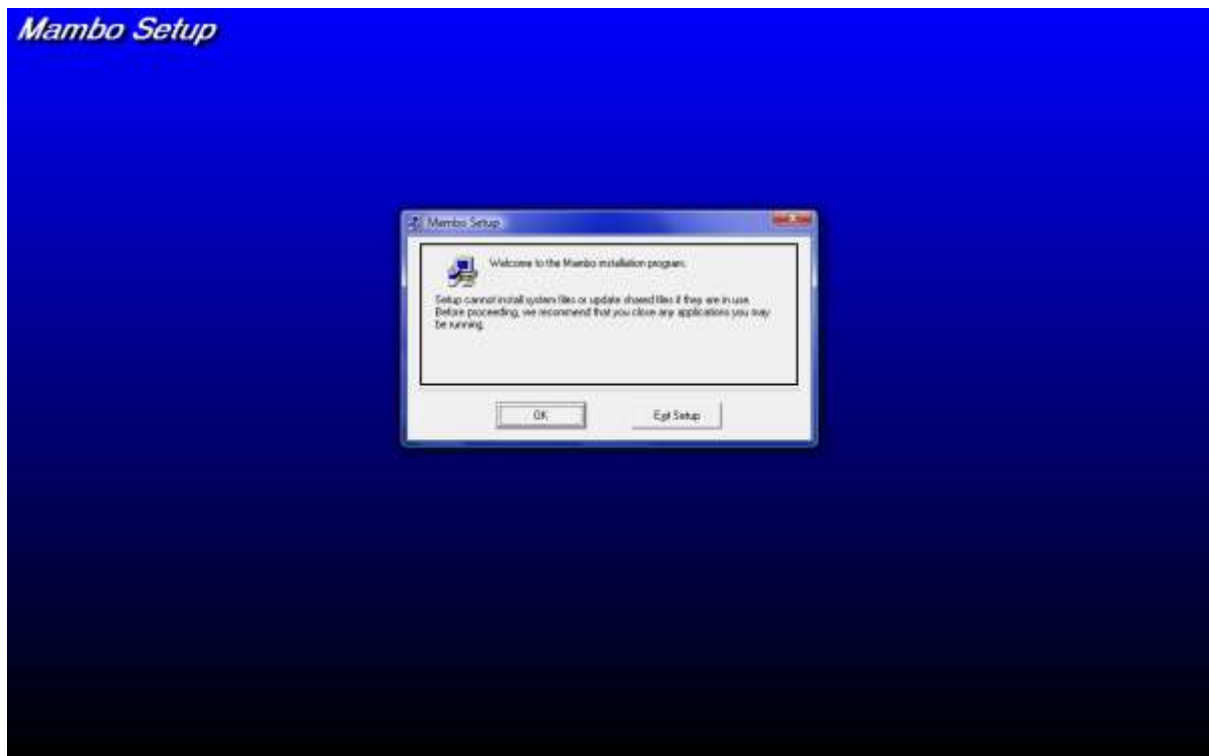
“SETUP.EXE Application” or
“SETUP Application “

depending on how you have configured Windows.)

You will probably get a pop up windows asking for permission to run the SETUP program. (it will have “An unidentified program wants access to your computer

Click Allow .

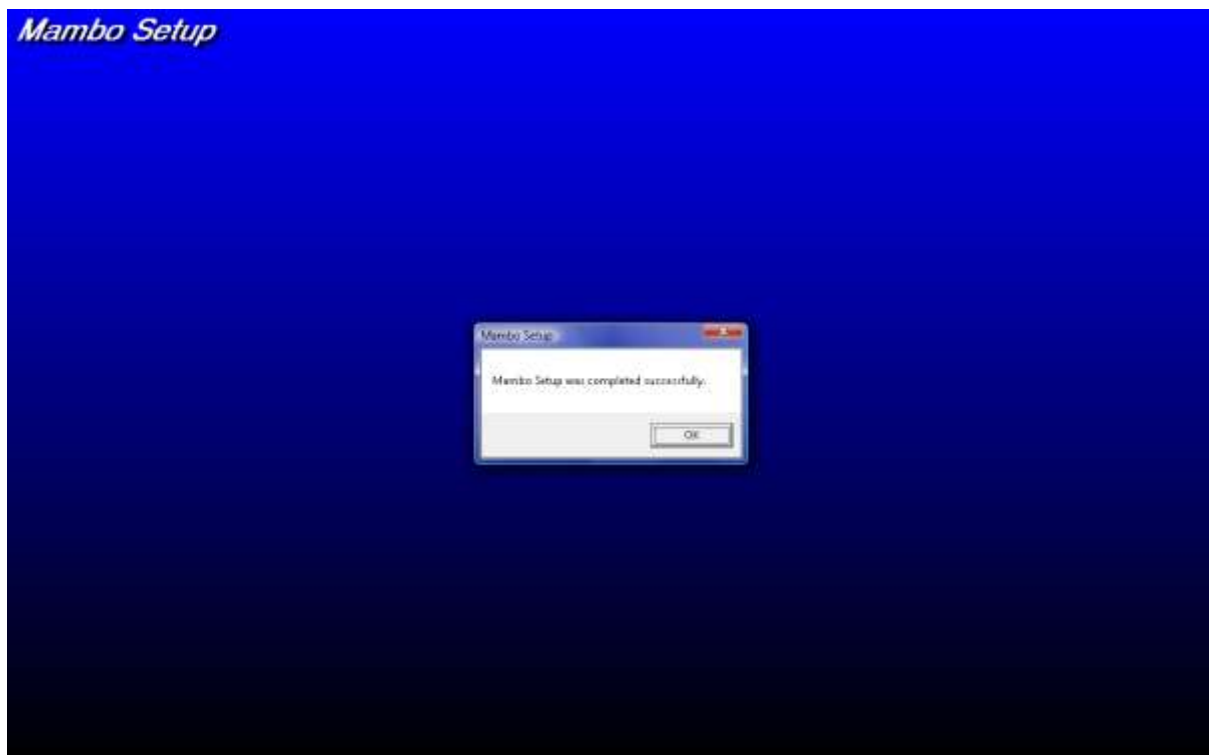
You will then be in the Mambo set up routine.



Click OK (Mambo is not fussy about other programs running) and you will see



To complete the set up click the large computer icon After a few seconds you should get the message



Click OK and Mambo is now installed! See the documentation on the web for how to use Mambo.
